- \_\_\_\_\_ By using nonviolent civil disobedience first in South Africa and then in India, this leader inspired worldwide movements for civil rights.
- \_\_\_\_\_ This Nobel Peace Prize laureate founded Solidarity, the Soviet bloc's first independent trade union, and served as the president of Poland.
- \_\_\_\_\_ This Roman Catholic nun performed many charitable acts. Her humanitarian work in India is well-known.
- \_\_\_\_\_ This French peasant led efforts to rid France of the English but was later accused of heresy and burned at the stake.
- \_\_\_\_\_ This Burmese opposition leader served nearly 15 years of house arrest and won the 1991 Nobel Peace Prize.
- \_\_\_\_\_ This Swedish humanitarian rescued tens of thousands of Hungarian Jews during the Holocaust.
- \_\_\_\_\_ This revolutionary president of South Africa fought against apartheid.
- \_\_\_\_\_ This Kenyan environmental activist and Nobel Peace Prize recipient founded the Green Belt Movement to reforest Africa.
- \_\_\_\_\_ This queen of the British Iceni tribe led an uprising against the occupying forces of the Roman Empire.
- \_\_\_\_\_ This polar explorer is famous for his part in the rescue of the crew of the Endurance.
