An Architectural Survey of Shaker Height's Moreland Neighborhood

The Moreland Neighborhood in the southeast corner of the City of Shaker Heights contains distinctive architecture from the first half of the 20th Century. Although different from the predominant styles found throughout the rest of the City, these house types reflect the unique development history of the Moreland Neighborhood.

- An architectural style guide would help build resident knowledge and pride and could be used as a training tool for surveyors;
- A full survey could be used to help get the neighborhood historically designated on the local or national level, should that be the desire of the residents;
- A full survey could help the neighborhood association, building department and neighborhood revitalization to monitor changes to the houses over time.

What is Needed to Complete An Architectural Survey

- An architectural style guide (CRS can complete);
- Community surveyors;
- A training session for surveyors (CRS an plan and conduct);
- A survey form (depends on how information will be used);
- Community feedback (which will help determine how information will be used):
 - Are residents interested in an expansion of the National Register
 District or in being designated a separate National Register
 Historic District? (Planning staff, local historians, and CRS could
 help complete an NR Preliminary Questionnaire).
 - Are Moreland residents interested in being designated locally?
- High quality digital cameras (TBD)
