Organization and Burten, Bell, Carr Development. An Enterprise Rose Architectural Fellow, Rodriguez is now working developing an eco-district framework for city leaders and community members in the city of Cleveland.

Rodriguez was assisted in leading the design workshop by David Jurca of the Cleveland Urban Design Collaborative and its Making Our Own Space (MOOS@Shaker) for youth in Shaker's Moreland neighborhood.

Supported by the city of Shaker Heights, MOOS has students building and designing physical items that enhance their community. The focus is on public parks and vacant city-owned lots.



- Kent State's Cleveland Urban Design Collaborative (CUDC) Making Our Own Space @Shaker Heights (MOOS) project operates arts-focused after-school workshops and summer camps for middle and high school students. CUDC programming began in summer 2018 with a group of Moreland youth who have already begun transforming


